## NA WE WE SPORT JAMBOREE -BERTOUA: "Uniting Through Sports"

The Na We We Sport Jamboree culminated in a vibrant closing ceremony presided over by the Minister of Youth and Civic Education. It celebrated youth Affairs engagement, community spirit, and athletic excellence. This year's edition brought together internally displaced persons from conflict-affected NW/SW and Far North Regions, refugees from the Central African Republic, and host communities in the East Region to build social cohesion and advance and sustainable peace development. High points included: athletes' community service, tree planting, eating together, and a workshop on preventing electoral violence. The closing ceremony served as a testament to the hard work and dedication of participants, highlighting the importance collaboration and empowerment in shaping a brighter future for our youth.

### **Caravan of Hope: Spreading Unity and Empowerment**

The Caravan of Hope was a vibrant parade that drew more than 1,500 participants, showcasing the spirit of community and youth empowerment. Attendees rallied together, sharing messages of solidarity and encouraging local support for youth initiatives. The colorful procession not only lifted spirits but also reminded everyone of the strength found in unity, setting a positive tone for the activities to come.

### **Community Clean-Up Campaign**

The Community Clean-Up Campaign saw the participation of 135 dedicated volunteers focused on revitalizing our environment. They cleaned two local sporting facilities and enhanced tree planting sites, working tirelessly to remove litter and clear debris. With the support of the city council, this initiative not only improved the facilities but also promoted environmental stewardship and community pride. Together, we made a significant impact in creating a cleaner, greener environment for all.



## Roots of Change: Community Tree Planting

The Community Tree Planting Initiative brought together local residents and youth to enhance the environment and promote sustainability. Participants planted 300 trees of various species, fostering a sense of ownership and responsibility toward their surroundings. This hands-on activity not only beautified the community but also highlighted the importance of environmental stewardship, leaving a lasting impact for future generations.



## **Elections Workshop**

The Elections Workshop was a dynamic and engaging session designed to educate 40 young participants on the importance of peaceful and inclusive electoral participation. Focusing on the intersection of sports and civic engagement, the workshop encouraged attendees to explore how teamwork, respect, and collaboration in sports can translate to positive practices in the electoral process. Through interactive discussions and activities, participants learned about their rights, the significance of their voices, and how to actively engage in their communities during elections. This empowering initiative aimed to inspire a new generation of leaders committed to fostering democracy and promoting peace in their society.









The Focus Group Discussion engaged 189 community members, providing a platform to share insights on pressing local issues such as youth empowerment and environmental sustainability. This collaborative environment encouraged diverse viewpoints and fostered a sense of ownership among attendees. By amplifying voices and facilitating constructive conversations, the discussion aimed to identify actionable solutions and strengthen community ties for positive change.

The UNFPA Caravan successfully reached over 200 participants, fostering community engagement through focus group discussions. Following the event, informative sensitization sessions were held to address vital health issues and promote awareness. This initiative aimed to empower the community and enhance understanding of reproductive health and well-being.





The UNFPA Mobile Clinic provided essential healthcare services to over 394 participants at the closing ceremony. It offered various medical tests, including blood pressure checks, glucose screenings, and STI tests, all with instant results. Additionally, the clinic provided over-the-counter medications and counseling for follow-up care, ensuring ongoing support for patients' health needs.

The Community Bonfire Night brought residents together for a cozy evening of nostalgia and connection. Roasting maize evoked warm memories of home and togetherness, while participants engaged in meaningful conversations about drug abuse and strategies to support those in withdrawal. The event highlighted the importance of living together in harmony, fostering a supportive community spirit. As the flames danced, attendees shared stories and ideas, strengthening bonds and promoting a collective commitment to wellbeing.





#### **Football Male**

The Men's Football Championship concluded with Unité securing first place, followed by Tolerance in a strong second. The tournament showcased remarkable talent and teamwork, celebrating the spirit of competition. The awards included the Top Goal Scorer, Zoungere Delphin, the Best Player, Dogo Steve, and the Most Disciplined Player, Ousman Tanko.



### Football Female

The Women's Football Championship ended with Non à la Haine clinching first place, followed by Cohesion Sociale in second. AMPILE from Non à la Haine was named Best Player, while ADDA'A APOUMAN earned the Top Goal Scorer title. The event highlighted female talent and promoted empowerment and teamwork, fostering community unity.

#### Handball Female

The handball finals featured an intense match between Non à la Haine and Unity 4 Peace, with Non à la Haine emerging victorious.
